The new Musik-Messe Nuremberg is about to get underway

From Friday 24 to Sunday 26 March 2023, the Music Fair will be held for the first time at the Nuremberg Exhibition Centre and will accompany the Freizeit Messe (22 to 26 March 2023). The Musik-Messe focuses on the diversity and quality of handcrafted musical instrument making and is aimed at musicians, from beginners to professionals.

Nuremberg – Students of music, orchestral musicians and soloists but also specialist dealers from Germany and abroad will find instruments as well as top-level advice at the Musik-Messe Nuremberg (Nuremberg Music Fair). At the fair, visitors can play the instruments and find out about their special features directly from the instrument makers. The Musik-Messe Nuremberg is thus the only platform in Germany that offers musicians an offering of this breadth. Together with over 30 concerts that are included in the price of admission and numerous workshops and demonstrations by craftspeople, the event represents an exciting new concept.

150 exhibitors: focus on handcrafted instrument making

At the Musik-Messe Nuremberg, string and plucked instruments, woodwind and brass wind instruments will be on display, as well as pianos and grand pianos. Instruments can be fully tested at the fair and the makers will be on site in person to give explanations about details in sound and workmanship. Many exhibitors are based in the Nuremberg metropolitan region, while other companies come from all over Germany, Austria and Italy. From suppliers and manufacturers to distributors, the entire value chain is represented. The focus is on exchanging ideas and discovering new trends in the industry.

Over 30 concerts – from classical to pop

Highlights are the over 30 concerts that are open to all visitors: big bands and orchestras will perform at the Musik-Messe Nuremberg, including renowned musicians. Instrument makers will make parts of musical instruments live at the fair and present their craft in action.

Workshops in the Education Centre

In several separate rooms, various workshops will be held on all three days, such as methodical group lessons or individual testing of instruments, together with the instrument makers.

In addition, Deutsche Musikinstrumentenpreis (the German Musical Instrument Award) will be presented at the Musik-Messe Nuremberg. This is considered the most renowned instrument-making competition in Europe and is awarded annually by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Climate Action.

The concept for the new Musik-Messe Nuremberg was developed by the trade fair organiser AFAG Messen und Ausstellungen in cooperation with Christoph Endres, the head master craftsman for musical instrument making. Partners of the Musik-Messe Nuremberg are the Federal Association of German Musical Instrument Manufacturers, the Federal Guild Association for the Musical Instrument Trade, the North Bavarian Music Association and the German Tuba Forum.

Nuremberg Music Fair and Leisure Fair in combination

Musik-Messe Nuremberg and Freizeit Messe can be visited using one ticket. Also, THE VILLAGE Nuremberg Whisk(e)y Fair (from 18 years of age) will be a guest at the Exhibition Centre at the same time, and can be visited with an additional transfer ticket.
